

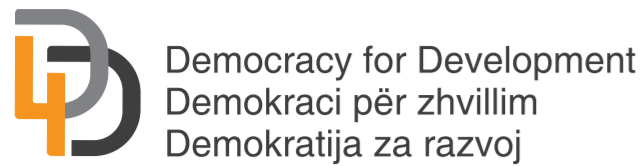

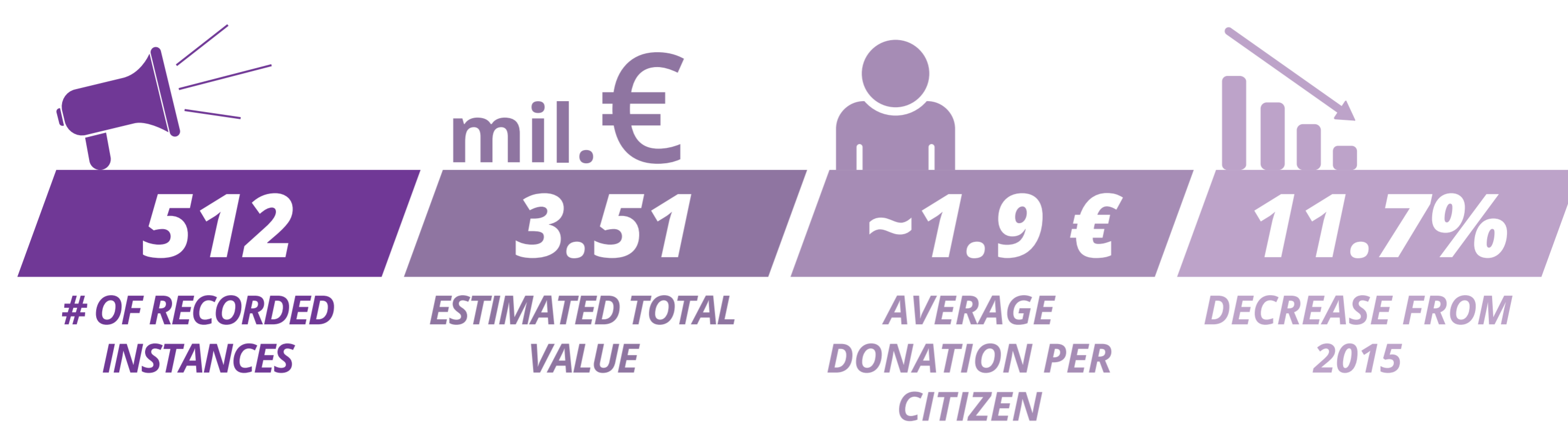

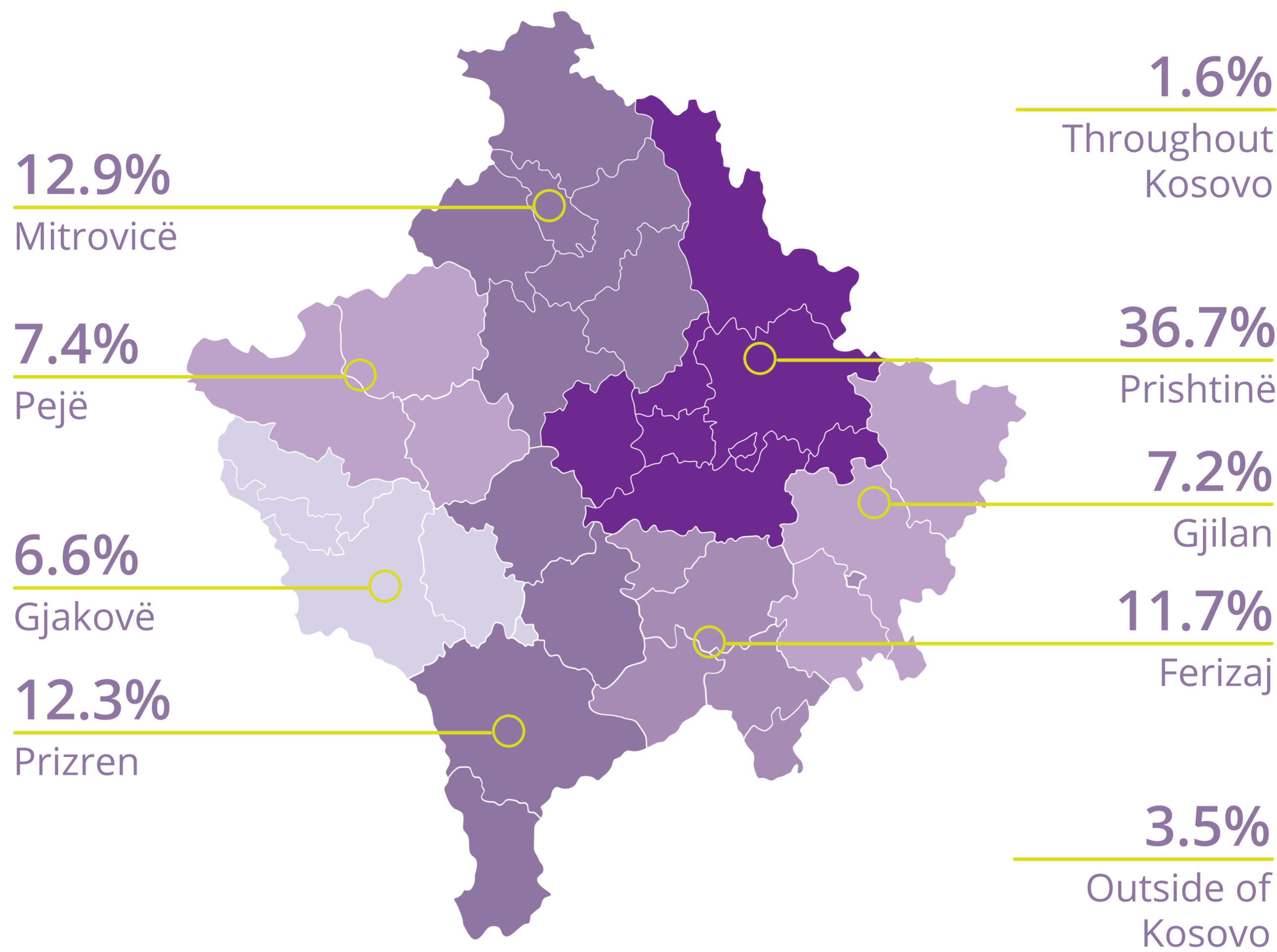

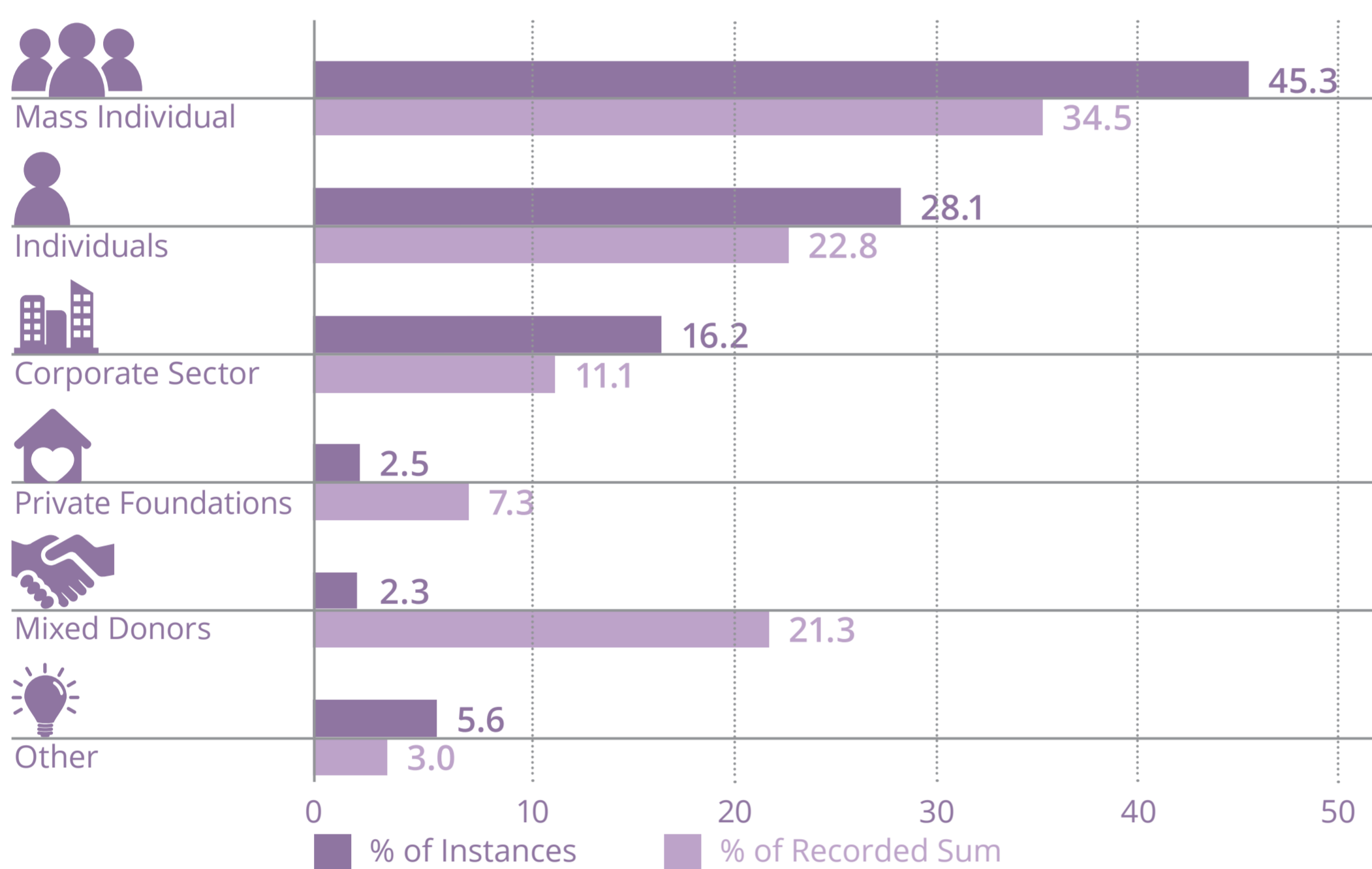


GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION

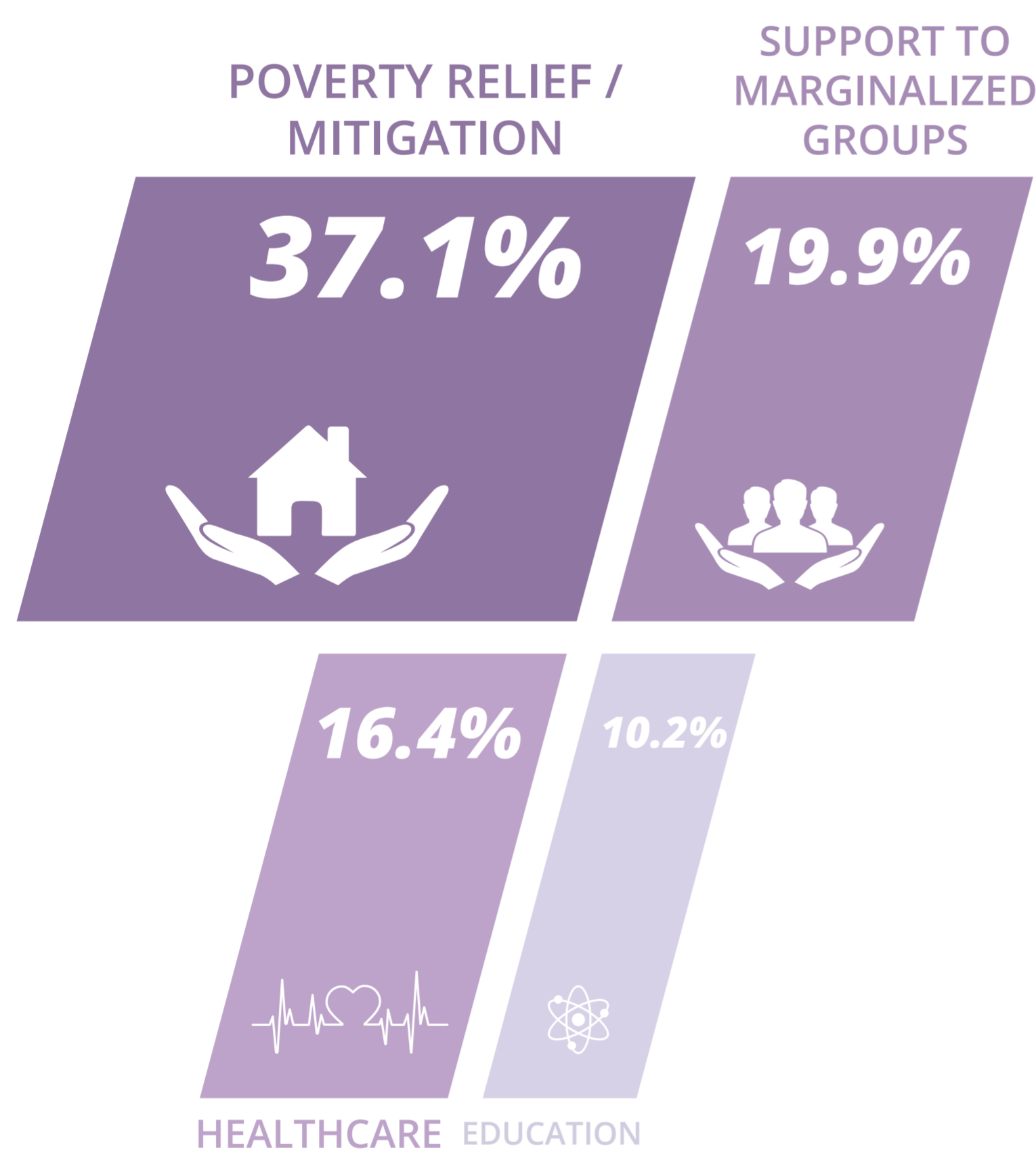

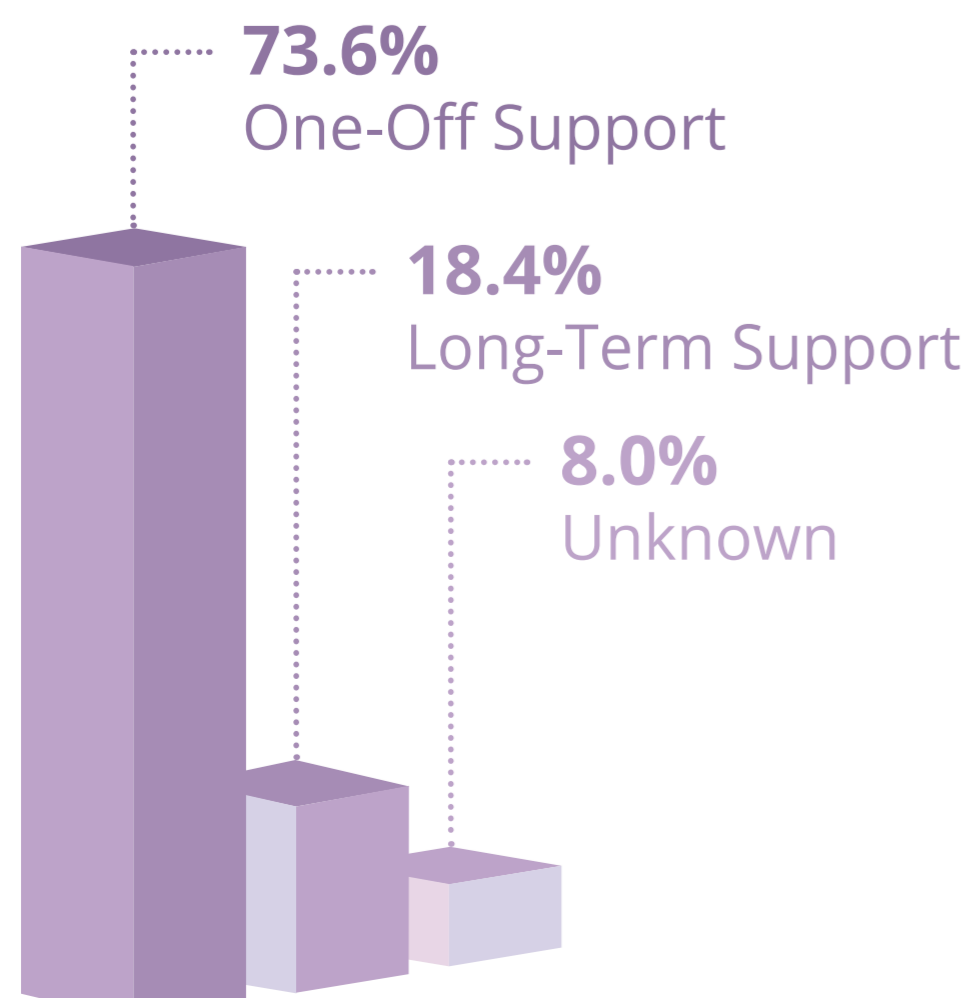
