

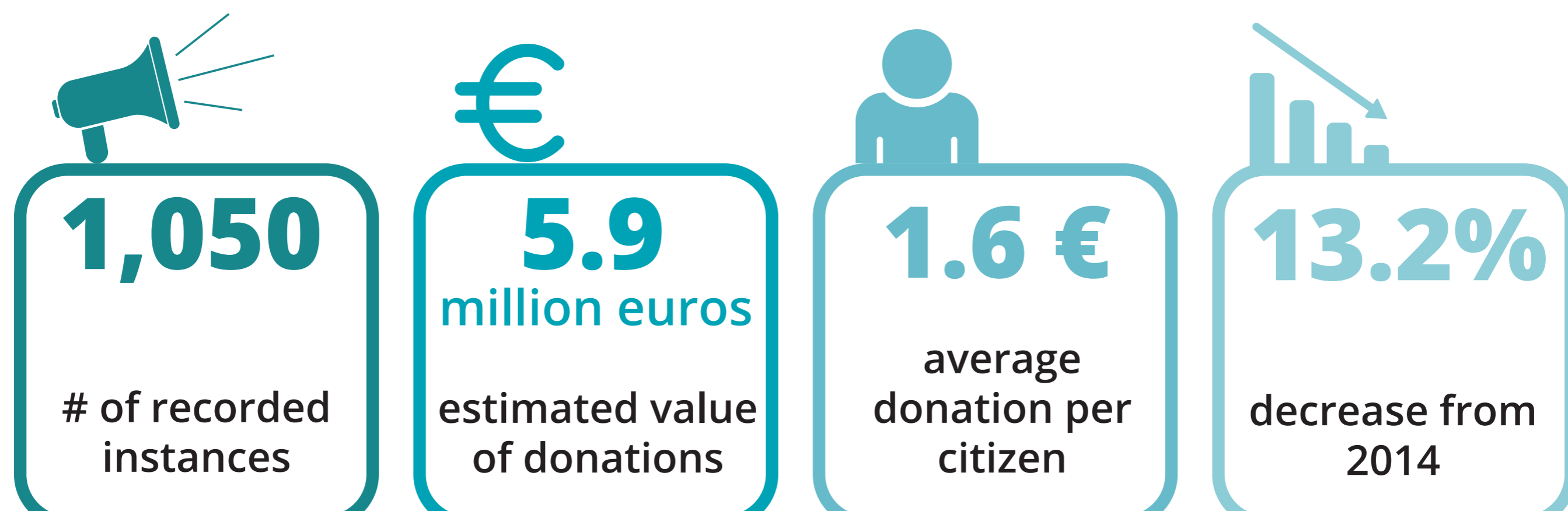

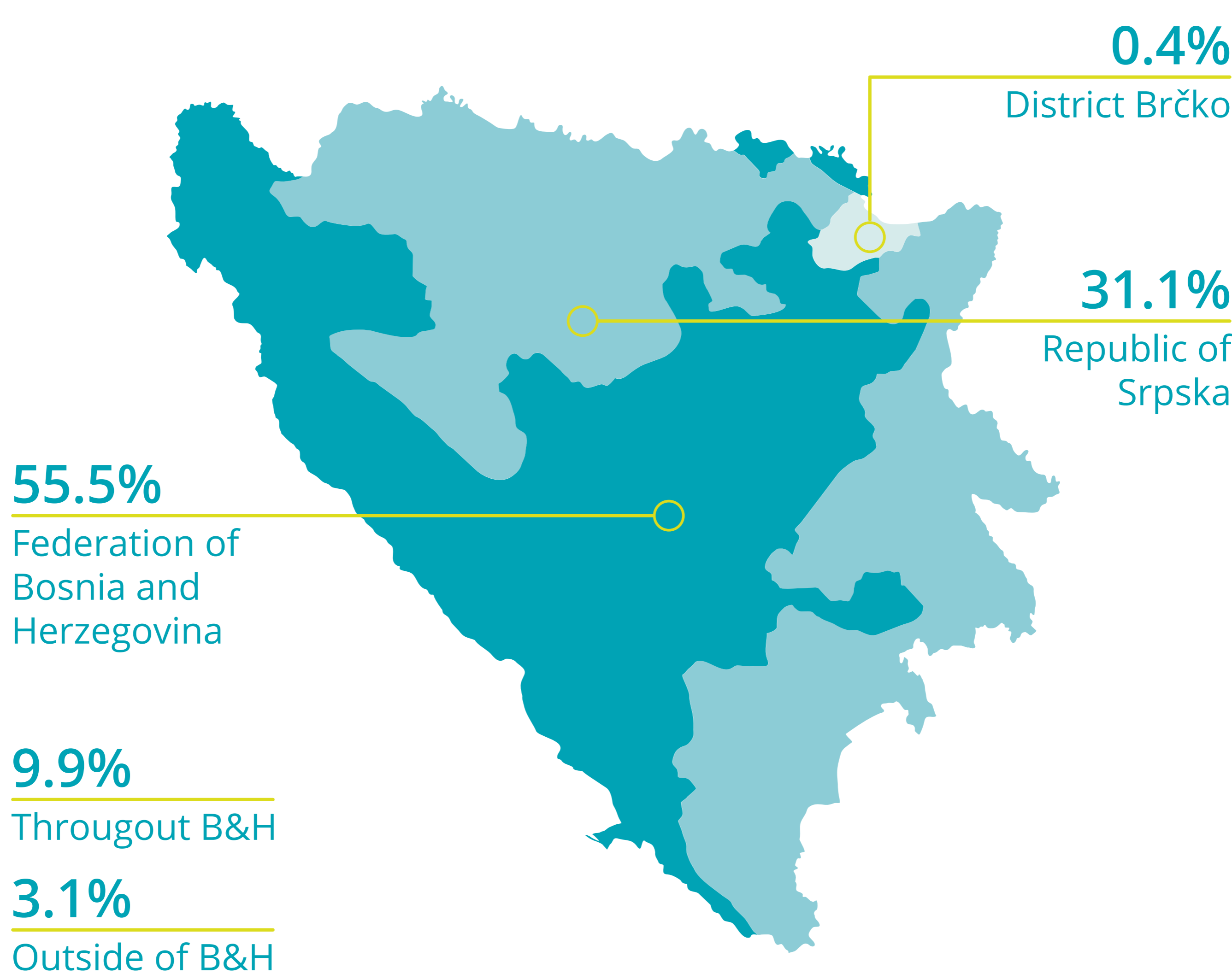

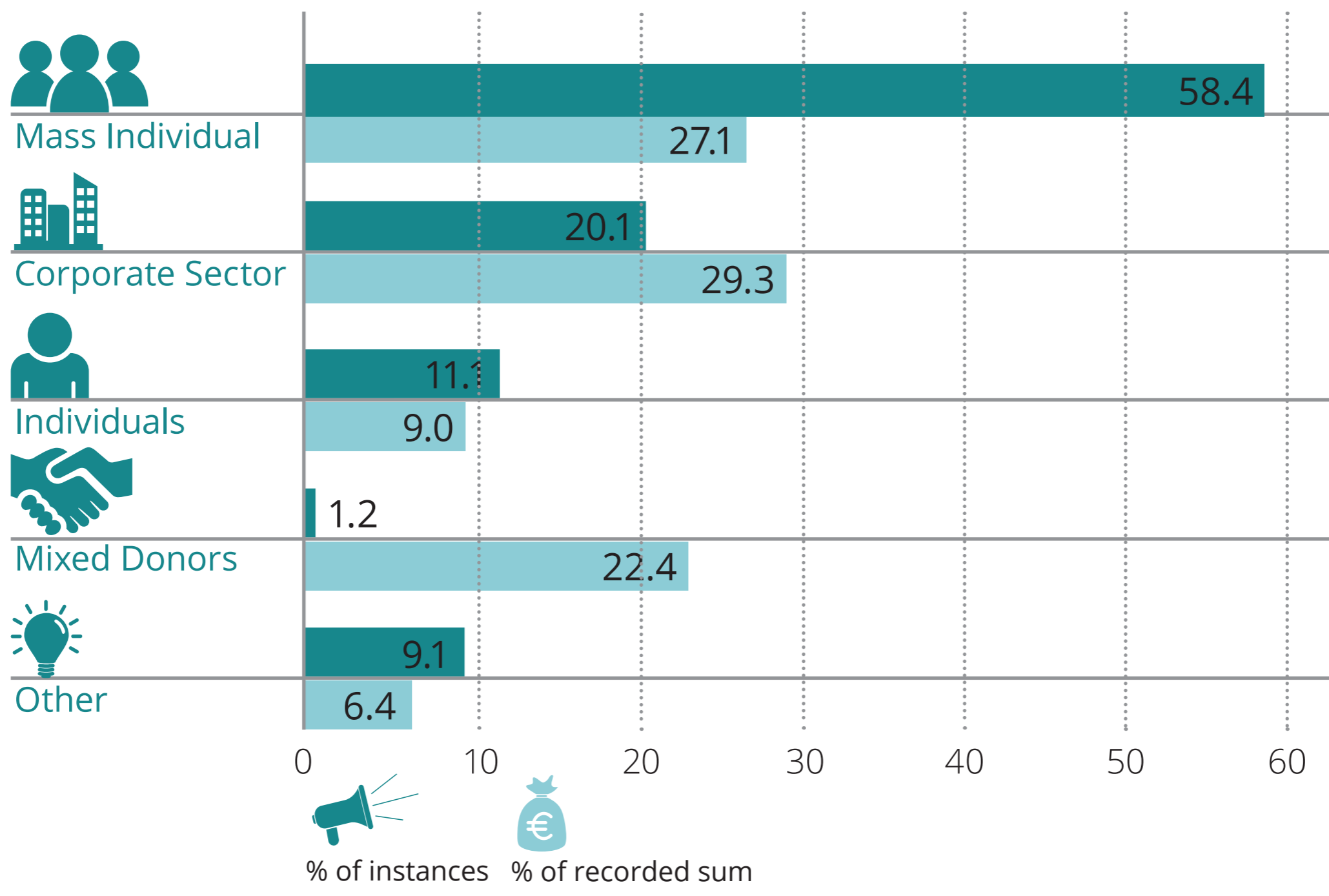


GEOGRAPHIC DISTRIBUTION

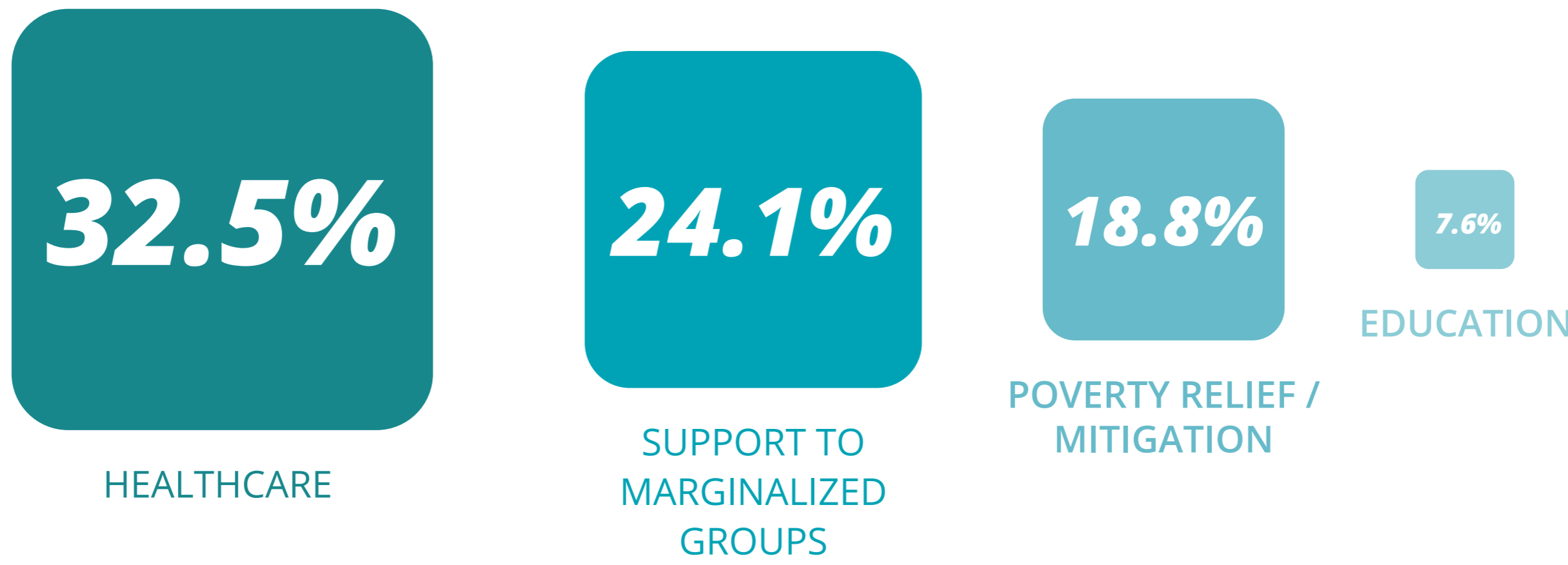

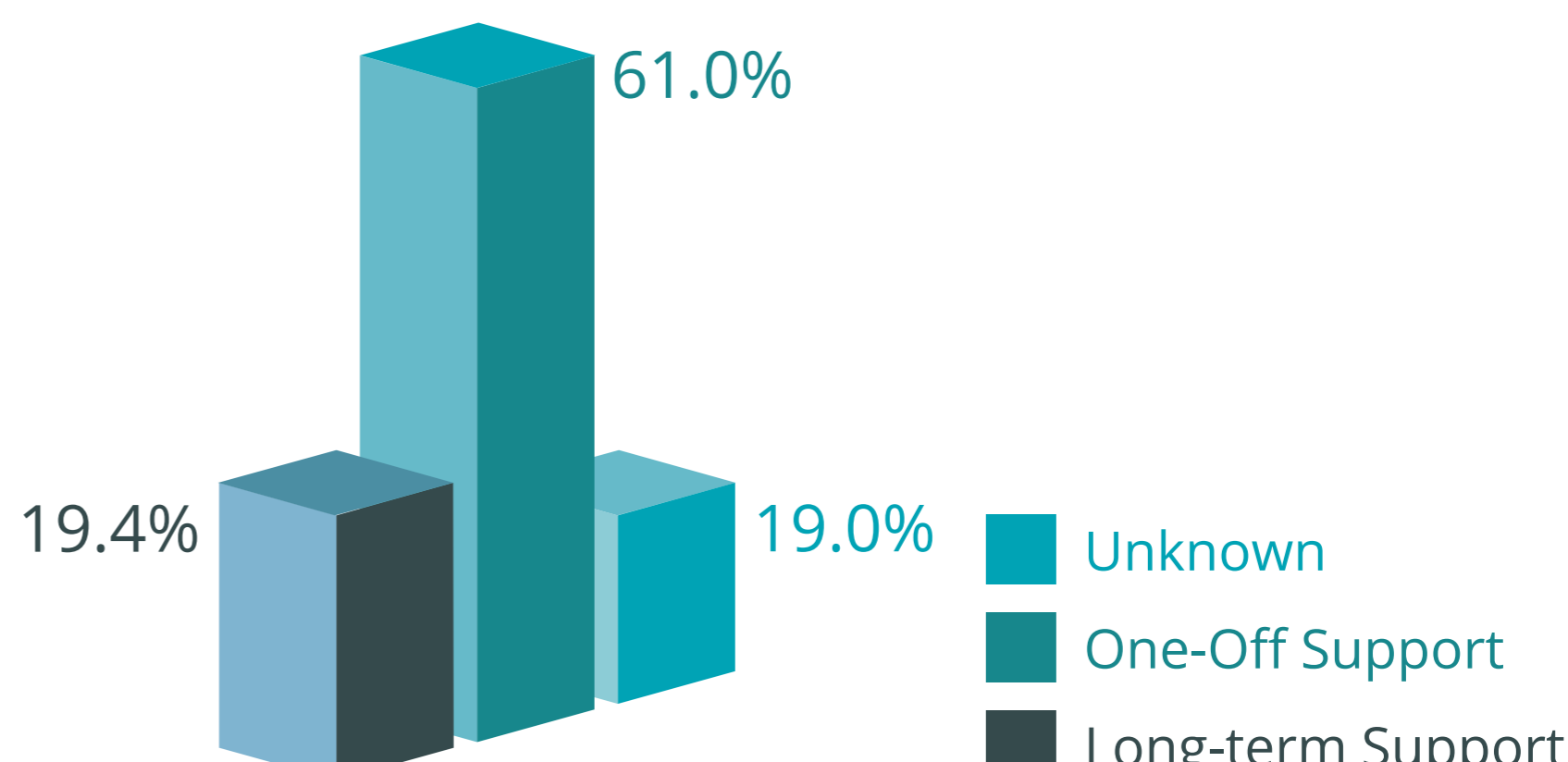
